**From 190**

- Take Interstate 190 (George Bush) east
- To Hwy 78, go northeast to Wylie
- Stay on 78 (through Sachse , Wylie to Lavon)
- Turn Right at Highway 205 traffic light go south towards Rockwall
- At traffic light (approx. 4 mi) turn left onto FM552, you will be going east for approx. 2 mi
- Turn right at FM 1141, you will be going south for approx 2 mi.
- Turn left on Cornelius Road for approx 1 mi (you will be going east)
- Turn left onto a private road: Jones Road...just past a two story white house
- The private road is our drive and the building is straight ahead

**DOG FIRST AID**

*(Notes from Dr. Kenneth Cantrell , D.V.M. who spoke at the May meeting)*

**Pad foot cuts**– Start with pressure and then use superglue by pulling skin together and placing glue on top.

**Puncture wounds**– Irrigate using a syringe with peroxide. Let it drain and then put on an antibiotic ointment or betadine or eye irrigating solution.

**Insect stings**-use an antihistamine such as Benedryl. You might act a cortico steroid such as prednisone along with the antihistamine. Seek vet attention if there is any problem breathing

**Snake bites**-Do not use antihistamines. Use corticosteroids and get to vet.

**Eye injuries**– Flush with any solution safe for eyes such as artificial tears or contact lens solution. Use cold compresses. Do not use eye drops with corticosteroid if cornea is torn. Do not use superglue on eyelids.

**Ear Infections**-Cobine neosporin, cortaid, and a little baby oil and put deep in ear.

**Hot Spots**-Clean with water for ten minutes. Put a mixture of Cortaid and Neosporin on the hot spot.

**Vomiting and Diarrhea**- You can use preparations such as Pepto Bismal, Kaopectate, Donagel, Immodium, Pepcid, Tums, Tagamet depending upon the symptom.

**Orthopedic Injuries**, Immobilize fractures. Use antiinflammatories for ACL injries. To find sensitive areas start systematically from small toes upward.

A vet from Danville, Ohio has recently noted that raisins can be very toxic to dogs. When she contacted poison control at the ASPCA National Animal Poison Control Center, she was told as few as **seven** raisins could be a problem for a dog. The dog she treated had eaten half a canister of raisins, went into renal failure, and despite heroic medical procedures, did not do well and eventually was euthanized. Grapes are also said to be a problem.
