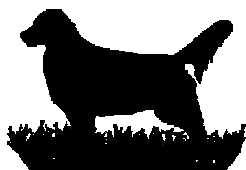

Sweetener Xylitol can be toxic to dogs

The American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals' Animal Poison Control Center is warning veterinarians, their staff, and pet owners that the xylitol—a sweetener found in some sugar-free chewing gums, candies, and other products can cause serious—possibly life-threatening problems for dogs.

The American Society for the Prevention of Dogs ingesting large amounts of products sweetened with xylitol may have a sudden drop in blood sugar, resulting depression, loss of coordination, and seizures, according to Dr. Eric K. Dunayer, a consulting veterinarian in clinical toxicology for the poison control center. The center is most concerned about products in which xylitol is the primary ingredient. The American Society for the Prevention of "These signs can develop quite rapidly, at times less than 30 minutes after ingestion of the product," Dr. Dunayer said in a statement. "Therefore, it is important that pet owners seek veterinary treatment immediately."

The American Society for the Prevention of Some data suggest a link between xylitol ingestion and liver failure in dogs, he said, though those data are insufficient to draw firm conclusions. The American Society for the Prevention of Dr. Dunayer published a case study on xylitol toxicosis in April 2004 issue of the journal *Veterinary and Human Toxicology*.

Xylitol Toxicity:

A Warning to All Dog Owners

Xylitol is a sugar alcohol that is used in sugar-free products such as gum and candy, as well as for baking and is used in the production of certain low-carbohydrate products now on the market.

As early as the 1960's, experiments indicated a link between the ingestion of xylitol and hypoglycemia in dogs. However, it has only been recently that the ASPCA Animal Poison Control Center has begun to receive reports of xylitol toxicosis in dogs. It is believed that this recent rise is likely due to the increased use of products containing xylitol in the United States.

Effects of Xylitol Ingestion

In both humans and dogs, the levels of blood sugar are controlled by the body's release of insulin from the pancreas. In human xylitol ingestion does not cause any significant changes in insulin levels or, therefore, blood glucose. However, in dogs, xylitol causes a fast release of insulin, which results in a rapid decrease in blood glucose (hypoglycemia).

Clinical Signs

Clinical signs of xylitol toxicity can develop in as few as 30 minutes after ingestion. Clinical signs may include one or more of the following:

- a.. Vomiting
- b.. Weakness
- c.. Ataxia (uncoordinated movements)
- d.. Depression
- e.. Hypokalemia (decreased potassium)
- f.. Seizures
- g.. Coma
- h.. Liver dysfunction and/or failure

Treatment

After ingesting a xylitol-containing product a dog may receive one or more of the following treatments, depending on the amount of time that has lapsed since the ingestion occurred. The induction of vomiting is recommended if performed very soon after ingestion of the xylitol-containing product but before clinical signs develop. Frequent small meals or an oral sugar supplement may be used to manage dogs that have not yet shown clinical signs. Following the appearance of clinical signs intravenous dextrose can be used to control hypoglycemia. It may also be necessary to treat the patient for low potassium levels (hypokalemia), if indicated. Treatment should be continued until the blood glucose levels return to normal levels.

AKC HUNTING TESTS FOR RETRIEVERS
CHAPTER 2, QUALIFYING SCORES, AWARDED TITLES,
SECTION 1. QUALIFYING SCORES, PARAGRAPH 3
CHAPTER 2**

Section 1 In order to receive a Qualifying score in **Junior** Retriever Hunting Tests, a dog must acquire a minimum average of not less than five (5) in each of the abilities listed on the Evaluation Form, with an overall average score for the entire test of not less than seven (7). In order to receive a Qualifying score in **Senior and Master** Retriever Hunting Tests, not only must a dog receive an overall average of not less than seven (7.0) for the entire test, but it must also receive separate, independent average scores of not less than five (5.0) in each ability category related to **Marking**, as well as separate, independent average scores of not less than five (5.0) in each ability category related to **Blinds**.

**REVISIONS TO REGULATIONS AND GUIDELINES FOR
AKC HUNTING TESTS FOR RETRIEVERS
CHAPTER 5, PART II, EVALUATION AND SCORING
OF A DOG'S ABILITIES, PARAGRAPH 9
CHAPTER 5**

To Qualify in Junior Hunting Tests, a dog must receive an *overall average* of at least seven (7.0) for the entire test, and it must not have an *average score in any one ability* category below five (5.0). For example, a dog could score 7s, 8s or even 9s in some ability categories and fail to qualify if the average score in another category was below five (5.0).

To Qualify in Senior and Master Hunting Tests, a dog must receive an overall average of at least seven (7.0) for the entire test. Furthermore, it must receive a separate, independent average score of at least five (5.0) in each ability category related to Marking, and a separate, independent average score of at least five (5.0) in each ability category related to Blinds. For example, a dog could score 7s, 8 or even 9's in all of ability categories for Marking and fail to qualify if it has an average score below 5 in an ability category for Blinds. Calculating the average ability scores for Marks shall not be enhanced or augmented by the ability scores for Blinds, and vice versa.

All blinds shall be scored; and, to that end, each blind of any double blind shall be scored separately. For example, at the Master level where the present requirements call for a land blind and a water blind (at least one of which shall be a double blind in any combination), three (3) separate blinds shall be scored by the judges.

PLANNING HUNTING SITUATIONS, PARAGRAPH 8
CHAPTER 5**

Part 1. Never set up tests that are designed to trick the dog. Visible gun stations shall never be moved to another area to mislead the dog. *Whenever a blind is placed prior to a mark going down and it is to be run after the mark is retrieved, the blind shall never be placed in the same area of the fall or near enough to the gun station as to intentionally mislead the dog on its mark. This does not apply, however, to a bird that is thrown while a dog is running on a blind. Such a bird is not a trick, but a diversion bird for the dog on the blind and as such it is judged as a control situation, not as a mark.*

Section 2. When placing birds for blind retrieves, no more than one bird shall be placed at each blind location for the working dog to retrieve.

CHAPTER 5**

*Part 1. Hunting Tests are a team effort between dog and handler. Except when specifically prohibited by the Regulations, handlers are required to handle shotguns at all the Master and Senior levels. **However, when in the opinion of the judges it can be done safely, the handler may put the gun down in a manner directed by the judges after he or she has sent the dog for the first bird to be picked up.** Continued unsafe and inappropriate gun handling after being so advised by the Judges shall be, in and of itself, sufficient cause for Judges to score the dog/handler team a zero (0) in trainability at all levels of testing.*

CHAPTER 3, SECTION 16, A NEW SECOND PARAGRAPH
CHAPTER 3**

Section 16. The use of neoprene vest on a dog in Hunting Tests is prohibited.

CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS

Proposed additions in italics: Proposed deletions are underlined
(Pending Board Approval)

ARTICLE II Membership

(2) All applications are to be filed with the Membership Committee and each application is to be read at the first meeting of the Club following its receipt. *Names of applicants shall be published in the newsletter with request for member input to be submitted to the board. Said information shall be shared with membership prior to voting.* When the applicant has attended two (2) meetings or attended (1) meeting and worked (1) event, the application will be voted upon *at the next business meeting* to elect the applicant to voting membership or junior membership, as may be applicable.

Section 6. Termination of Membership.

A. Resignation. Any member in good standing may resign from the Club upon written notice to the Recording Secretary. Resignation of membership does not absolve the individual from any financial obligation owed to the Club at the time of resignation. *Upon resignation, a membership cannot be reinstated with application as a new member as provided in the bylaws.*

Section 1. Club Meetings.

The quorum for such meetings shall be twenty percent (20%) of the members in good standing and without a quorum no official business may be conducted. *Only for the purpose of electing new members, a quorum shall be 15 % of members in good standing.*

B. The Corresponding Secretary shall have charge of the correspondence, notify members of meetings, notify new members of their election to membership, notify officers and directors of their election to office, *chair the membership committee*, and carry out such other duties as are prescribed in these By-laws.

Section 5. Eligibility for Board of Directors.

A. No more than no more than one (1) person from a family *or household* may be nominated to or serve at any one time on the Board of Directors.

MISCELLANEOUS OR GENERAL STANDING RULES

III.

It is strongly recommended (although not required) that the term of committee chairmen be limited to two years. It is recommended that committee chairmen attend (or be represented by a designated committee member) a minimum of four(4) meetings annually. Performance event (Obedience, Field, Bench, Tracking, Field trial) committees are required *recommended* to meet a minimum of two times annually and sponsor one non-regular event(fun match, training day, seminar etc.)

*least three names shall be given to the committee chair based on the number of votes obtained at the meeting. Judges must received at least three votes to be considered. If the recommend judges are not available, the committee shall have the authority to make the final judge selection. In the event a previously assigned judge is unable to complete the assignment, the committee chair has full authority to choose the judge's replace***IV.**

Guidelines for Selecting Judges for Licensed Events

The selection of judges for bench/obedience shall be on the agenda for the May meeting. The selection of judges for field, tracking, and agility shall be on the agenda for the Spetmember meeting. Judges' names may be submitted in writing to the appropriate committee chair and nominations will be taken from the floor. At least three names shall be given to the committee chair based on the number of votes obtained at the meeting. Judges must received at least three votes to be considered. If the recommend judges are not available, the committee shall have the authority to make the final judge selection. In the event a previously assigned judge is unable to complete the assignment, the committee chair has full authority to choose the judge's replacement.

There shall be a meeting of the appropriate standing committee for the purpose of selecting judges for a licensed event. The time and place of such a meeting shall be announced in the newsletter for two consecutive months prior to the meeting date.

A solicitation for the submission of judges names shall be made in the newsletter for two months prior to the meeting date. In order to be valid, a submission (vote) shall contain the name of the prospective judge (s) as well as the name of the club member making the submission. Each member of the club is entitled to name one judge for conformation, one for obedience, two different names for the WC/WCX and two different names per hunting test level. The submission, which shall be in writing, by fax, or by e-mail shall count as a vote by the club member.

Discussions of the candidates for the judging assignment may be held at the committee meeting. A member attending such a meeting may cast a vote for a particular judge, or change his/her mind from an earlier submission.

The committee shall select for the judging assignment the individual receiving the most votes providing that he/she meets all requirements set forth in the rules and regulations for the event. However, the committee shall not select a judge who has received less than three votes, and shall go back to the club for the submission of more names if this situation arises, but shall be required to do so only one additional time.

After the premiums have been mailed, a vacancy which occurs in a judging assignment may be filled by the committee without following these guidelines, due to the emergency nature of the situation.

V. Membership Committee

The Corresponding Secretary shall head the membership committee. This Committee shall receive applications for membership and present them to the members for approval.

VI. Statistics Committee

The statistician shall keep all records confidential and shall not discuss individual standings with the general membership. The board shall review all statistics and eligibilities before submission to the trophy committee.

VII. Trophy Committee

This Committee shall, based on the Statistics Committee's report *and the board's approval*, verify determine eligible candidates for the Club's trophies and awards and present them to the Board for approval.

XIII.

Dogs six months or older may be listed at no charge, Older dogs will be listed with this committee, as long as the owner is a member of this club. Interested parties will be referred to the owners of the dog.

III.

The Club shall annually present a plaque *or other award* to each dog which completes requirements for any AKC, UKC, NAHRA, GRCA, USDAA or similar registry's title or degree during the calendar year.

Top Show Puppy

Only placements achieved when the puppy is handled by the owner, who is also a member, may be counted.
