IV. Guidelines for Selecting Judges for Licensed Events

Selection of judges for all licensed events shall be made at a Membership meeting. A quorum will not be required for the selection of judges. The Bench/Obedience judges shall be on the agenda for the May meeting. The meeting for the selection of judges for field, tracking, and agility shall be at the discretion of the respective chair. The chair is to notify the Board and the Newsletter editor one month prior to the requested meeting. The Judges' names may be submitted in writing to the appropriate committee chair and nominations will be taken from the floor.

After submission of all nominations, the voting will commence with each person voting only once in each round. It is recommended that only people participating in that venue vote. If fewer than three judges receive three or more votes, the voting will advance to a second round. The preference is to have at least three judges on the list with three or more votes. The committee chair is to contact the judges in the order of number of votes received. If none of the judges with three or more votes are available, the chair has the authority to select a judge with preference given to any judge nominated by the membership. In the event a previously assigned judge is unable to complete the assignment, the committee chair has full authority to choose the judge's replacement.

Top Show Puppy

Only placements achieved when the puppy is handled by the owner or a member of the immediate family, may be counted. The person handling the puppy must also be a member in good standing of the club.

CH Ducats Watchers Calamity Jane CD AX AXJ JH
WC VCX Perpetual Open Standard Trophy

The winner of this trophy shall be the dog who completes the Open Standard (20 or 24 inch divisions) title in the shortest number of CALENDAR DAYS from the first qualifying score to the third. Only these three scores will count towards the trophy. Qualifying scores from Open Jumpers with Weaves or Preferred classes shall not count towards the trophy.

In the event of a tie, placements will be used as the tie breaker with additional points as follows:

1st-5 pts
2nd- 3 pts
3rd- 1 pt
4th-1/2 pt

If the dogs are still tied, the dog with the highest placement on the first leg will win. If still tied the tie breaker will be the placement on the second leg and again, if still tied, the placement on the last leg shall be the tiebreaker.

All dogs competing for this trophy must be run by the club member owning the dog, immediate family, or club members residing in the same household. No qualifying scores from co-owners or professional handlers will count.
